



RECYCLE

All materials collected for recycling should be loose (don't tie up in a carrier bag), clean (a quick rinse is fine) and dry.

What can I recycle at home?

Metal

Food tins Pet food tins Drinks cans

Aerosols (empty)

Sweet & Biscuit tins

Clean kitchen foil

Clean foil trays

Metal lids from jars & bottles

- No other types of metals, e.g. cutlery, saucepans, tools etc
- Push sharp lids into cans
- Labels can be left on
- Take plastic lids off aerosols & put in loose
- Scrunch foil together to a tennis ball size
- A quick rinse is fine

Paper



Newspapers & magazines

Phonebooks

Catalogues

Junk mail/leaflets

Letters & envelopes

Greetings cards

- No glittery cards or paper
- No metallic/film coated wrapping paper
 - No sticky labels
- No paper with food or grease
- No kitchen towels/tissues
- Staples, paperclips & envelope windows can be left on

Card



Cardboard boxes Cereal boxes Ready meal card sleeves Egg boxes Kitchen roll/toilet tubes

Milk, juice & soup cartons

- Flatten boxes & tubes
- No food waste, e.g. the bottom of a pizza box
- No disposable coffee cups - recycle at some coffee shops or switch to a reusable cup

Glass



Glass food & drinks bottles/jars Fragrance bottles Moisturiser jars Make up jars

- No drinking glasses, Pyrex, window glass etc - No nail varnish bottles
- Leave labels on
- All glass colours accepted
- Lids back on
- A quick rinse is fine



Plastic Soft drinks bottles Milk/juice bottles Household cleaning bottles (detergent, bleach) Shampoo, conditioner & shower gel bottles Margarine/ice cream tubs Yoghurt or dessert pots Fruit punnets Meat/ready meal trays

- Squeeze bottles and pop the lids back on
- No plastic bags, films, wrap, packets, wrappers or pouches - now recycled at most supermarkets
- Black plastic trays accepted
- No hard plastics, e.g. toys, bins
