A Repair Café is a community initiative offering a friendly, social meeting place where people can bring their broken household items to be repaired by a team of multi-skilled volunteer repairers.



Depending on the volunteers available, Repair Cafés can fix electrical appliances, electronic devices, furniture, jewellery, ceramics, clothes, toys, clocks...and much more!

They usually run for about 3-4 hours on a Saturday once a month in an easy to access venue. Refreshments are available while you wait for a repairer to be free and these raise valuable funds for the initiative.
